LGBTQIA+ Youth

Health Partners on IPV + Exploitation (Futures Without Violence)

Nearly 1 in 11 female and approximately 1 in 14 male high school students report having experienced physical dating violence in the last year. To prevent violence from occurring in the first place, Health Partners invests in prevention strategies that promote healthy relationships among teens and young adults. Adolescents, especially LGBTQIA+ youth, may also become involved in the sex trade or experience human trafficking as a means of survival to pay for food, shelter, gender-affirming medical care, etc. Health Partners equips adolescent health care providers with the tools and resources needed to counsel young patients about healthy relationships and to assess for and respond to dating violence.
